The right person for the role will be able to:

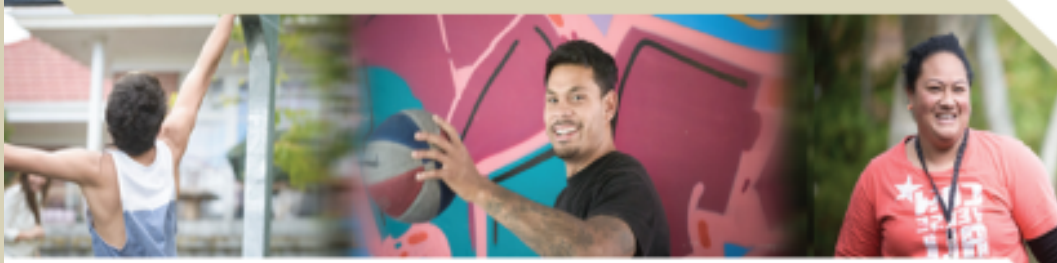
- Model appropriate behaviours, display Youth Horizons consistent values and exercise good judgment at all times
